## Checking our "To Do" lists

As we near the end of October, finishing work continues in the building, staff training is fully underway, and department move details are being finalized. The list of "things to do" is getting shorter, and the list of "things done" is getting longer. Here is a quick overview of some of the work being done this week, and upcoming key dates for the physical move for Women's Health and NICU to their new home at 665 William Avenue.

### Work this week:

- Mounting arms for NICU displays installation
- Cameras and monitors installation
- Fridge monitoring installation
- Miscellaneous mounting of fixtures, shelving, etc
- Pharmacy training begins
- Parking equipment installation and testing
- Finishing work to test and ensure systems are working correctly (for example: lights, alarms, overhead paging)

### Physical move key dates:

Nov 27	Begin move of offices and equipment not used before December 1
Nov 27	Surgical slate adjusted in partnership with St. Boniface Hospital and other providers
Nov 30	Set up for patient move day
Dec 1	0800 hrs first patient move, final equipment move 0730 no new patients admitted to 735 Notre Dame 0730 all new patients admitted to 665 William Ave
Dec 1	Once the move is completed, 735 Notre Dame will be closed.
