## Education and Orientation

The Child Health program offers education and orientation covering broad pediatric nursing topics, including a combination of independent learning, in-person case studies and skills training, simulation lab training, and buddy shifts.

- Children's Hospital Orientation Course (CHILL 1)
- Children's Hospital Orientation Course (CHILL 2)

Additional specialized education and orientation provided to nurses includes:

- Care of a patient who is on a cardiorespiratory monitor
- Care of a patient with a tracheostomy on ventilatory support
- Care of an oncology patient (including chemotherapy and bone marrow transplant [BMT])
- Care of a patient with an epidural or an external ventricular drain (EVD)
- Emergency Nursing Pediatric Course (ENPC)
- Pediatric Advanced Life Support (PALS)
- Trauma Nursing Core Course (TNCC)
