Education and Orientation

- Supportive orientation includes 10-15 buddied shifts for all hires
- Staged progression through lower to high acuity areas of the ED, including:
 - Level 1 a two-week training program through a combination of in- person, independent, virtual and skills lab training, covering broad emergency nursing topics.
 - Level 2 learning to care for higher acuity, more complex emergency patients, includes rhythm analysis for cardiac monitoring



- Level 3 Resuscitation Caring for complex, critically ill patients; including: intubated patients, stroke,
 major traumas, cardiac arrest, respiratory emergencies, shock and more
 - Advanced Cardiac Life Support (ACLS) Learn defibrillation, cardioversion, cardiac pacing and the anatomy of running a code blue
 - Triage and CTAS (Canadian Triage Acuity Score)- learn the art of managing a busy waiting room and prioritizing the sickest patient
 - Annual 8-hour, in-person emergency education day, including Annual BLS certification
 - Trauma Nursing Core Course (TNCC) an internationally accredited two-day practical course in emergency trauma nursing
