Rehabilitation Services Program

HSC Winnipeg's Rehabilitation program provides specialized inpatient rehabilitation services to residents of Manitoba, Northwestern Ontario and Nunavut.

Join the interdisciplinary team that delivers specialty inpatient rehabilitation care to more than 180 patients each year, maximizing the functional independence and quality of life of those living with the following diagnoses and complex rehabilitation needs:

Spinal Cord Injury

- subacute spinal cord lesions resulting in paraplegia or tetraplegia

Amputation

- upper and/or lower limb amputations due to peripheral arterial disease, diabetes, trauma, tumors, burns or frostbite

Neuromuscular/Neurolocomotor (NMSK) Injury

- orthopedic injuries or neurological damage from such diseases as neuropathies, cerebral palsy, multiple sclerosis, muscular dystrophy, post COVID-19 syndrome, generalized weakness and deconditioning secondary to complex medical problems.

As the only program of its kind within the province, this unit works collaboratively with programs in outpatient rehabilitation and ambulatory care services, to help patients return to the community following a life-altering injury or illness.

The interdisciplinary rehab team includes nursing and support staff, allied health professionals (e.g., occupational therapy, physical therapy, recreation therapy, social work, dietician, etc.), physicians, clinical assistant, Indigenous Health services, and spiritual care.
