CHILD HEALTH

<p>CK3 18 bed Med/Surg Unit</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>CK3 provides comprehensive care for all surgical patients, including both elective and emergent cases, as well as specialized treatment for burn and trauma patients. This ward features a two-bed high observation unit where children receive continuous cardio-respiratory monitoring, ensuring their safety and stability. Additionally, there is a two-bed epilepsy monitoring unit dedicated to assessing and managing pediatric epilepsy. The facility also includes four designated medical beds for general and acute medical patients, allowing for a versatile approach to patient care and treatment across various needs.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 3-4 Patients</p>
<p>CH5 22 bed Medical Unit</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>CH5 serves a diverse range of patient groups, focusing on acute medical care and complex discharges. The unit is equipped to treat children with brain and spinal cord injuries, as well as those with cystic fibrosis. It also provides specialized support for children facing eating disorders, feeding difficulties, and developmental disabilities or complex medical needs. Additionally, CH5 has the capacity to monitor two patients requiring oxygen saturation assessment, including those who are stable on CPAP. This comprehensive approach ensures that each child receives personalized, high-quality care tailored to their unique health challenges.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 4 Patients</p>
<p>CK5 16 Beds Medical Unit</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>CK5 is a specialized medical unit that focuses on hematology, oncology, bone marrow transplant, peritoneal dialysis, and renal transplant patients. The dedicated nursing staff plays an integral role in all aspects of patient care, collaborating closely with an interdisciplinary team to deliver comprehensive treatment and support.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 3-4 Patients</p>





<p>CH4 22 Bed Medical Unit</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>A medical unit that includes a 4 bed monitored room for children requiring a higher level of care and observation. Most rooms have isolation capabilities and are typically used for patients with infectious respiratory illnesses. Pediatric subspecialties that care for patients on CH4 include metabolics, neurology, gastroenterology, Infectious Disease (ID) and respirology.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 4-5 Patients</p>
<p>CK4/PSCU 6 Beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>A unit for technologically dependent children, many requiring long-term mechanical ventilation. Focus of care is on teaching and coordination of care/services to enable caregivers to manage their child’s care in the community</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 3-4 Patients</p>
<p>Pediatric Intensive Care Unit 10 Beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>PICU is a critical care unit that cares for children 2 days to 17 years of age, with any critical medical and / or surgical health issue. This unit also provides services to all newborns, infants and children (2 to 100 kg.) who require Continuous Renal Replacement Therapy (CRRT). The PICU also runs the Code Blue Team as well as the Pediatric Rapid Response Team, a “pre-code” team that strives to prevent a code or critical deterioration by providing consultation and/or patient stabilization within 15 minutes</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 1-2 Patients</p>
<p>Children’s ER 50,000 visits/year</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>The Children’s Hospital Emergency Department cares for children who present with all levels of emergencies with access to all pediatric specialties</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – No specific ratio</p>



<p>Pediatric Day Unit- CS3</p> <p>1800-2400 patients/year</p>	<p>The PDU, located on CS3 provides a setting for children needing tests or treatments that can be provided as an outpatient rather than as an inpatient such as specialized IV infusions Procedural sedation is also performed on PDU for children undergoing painful procedures.</p>
<p>Neonatal Intensive Care Unit (NICU)</p> <p>60 physical beds (~1150 admissions per year</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>The NICU provides care for babies requiring complex care as well as providing state of the art ventilation management and support. We prioritize Family Integrated Care to ensure that each patient's family is actively involved in their care process. In addition, we prepare convalescing infants and families for discharge home. We have a High Risk Infant Resuscitation Team that attends deliveries and stabilizes infants immediately post-delivery. Infants requiring cardiac surgery are transferred to Stollery Children's Hospital in Edmonton as part of the Western Canadian Children's Heart Network. Other surgery on newborns is done at Children's Hospital. We work collaboratively with St. Boniface General Hospital where the WRHA Child Health Program has a 30 bed level 2 & 3 NICU. Collaborate effectively with fellow nurses in the NICU, where the unit is organized into a Pod system, with each Pod encompassing 12 beds. This structure facilitates a cohesive and supportive work environment</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 1-2 Patients</p>



EMERGENCY PROGRAM

<p>Adult ER</p> <p>Serves over 78,000 patients annually</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>As an integral part of the Provincial Trauma Program, the Adult Emergency Department provides tertiary care for patients with multiple traumas from across Manitoba, the Northwest Territories, Nunavut and Northwestern Ontario. The ED features comfortable, private surroundings for patients and their families, with large exam and treatment cubicles, walls between patient cubicles and large waiting rooms. It incorporates state-of-the art design and systems to enhance infection control and safety for both patients and staff. A sophisticated ED Information System (EDIS) automates such functions as triage, patient tracking, orders, results, documentation and discharge. Fast, easy access to clinical information provides for improved patient flow through the Emergency Department. In the Adult Emergency Room, we organize patient care based on acuity levels. Most areas utilize a buddy nurse system, where two nurses are assigned to manage 7-8 patients, ensuring effective and attentive care for each individual</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 2 nurses: 7-8 Patients</p>
<p>Children’s ER</p> <p>50,000 visits/year</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>The Children’s Hospital Emergency Department cares for children who present with all levels of emergencies with access to all pediatric specialties</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – No specific ratio</p>



Medicine Program

<p>GB3 (currently A4) 24 bed</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>A diverse unit that includes acute medicine clinical teaching patients and telemetry monitoring. Patients require all aspects of care including monitoring, medical intervention and disposition planning. Nurses on the unit have an active function in all aspects of patient care along in collaboration with the unit's interdisciplinary team.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 6 Patients</p>
<p>GD4/GH4/GD5 30 beds each</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>These 3 units are each a 30 bed Tertiary Care Medicine Clinical Teaching Unit (CTU). Each unit's team provides care to the complex medical patient with a variety of diagnosis and co-morbidities and/or who may be experiencing multi-system failure. Patients require all aspects of care including monitoring, telemetry, medical intervention and disposition planning. Nurses on the unit have an active function in all aspects of patient care in collaboration with the unit's interdisciplinary team. These wards handle a similar level of patient acuity,</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>
<p>WRS3/WRS2 24 beds/6 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>A medicine unit. Patients are admitted through ER, from clinics (ie: Cancer Care or Infectious Diseases clinic), or from intensive care; however, most patients are transferred in from the clinical teaching units (CTU's) on the 4th floor. Patients transferred in have completed the acute phase of their illness and are currently stable, but still require medical treatment and intervention, and more complex discharge planning. All patients have been made non-teaching prior to admission/transfer to the unit.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 6 Patients</p>





<p>WRS5 16 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>In our Acute Stroke Unit, we specialize in providing comprehensive care for patients who have experienced a stroke. Patients are typically transferred to our unit 24 hours post-stroke to receive support during the critical early stages of recovery. Collaborate effectively with interdisciplinary team members to provide comprehensive and coordinated care, ensuring that each patient's needs are met through a collaborative approach that leverages the expertise of various healthcare professionals</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 6 Patients</p>
<p>GD6 15 beds (plus 3 beds over census)</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>A HEPA filtered unit that specializes in the provision of care to patients with acute haematological malignancies and/or diseases. Complex medical and nursing care includes administration of high dose chemotherapy and blood and marrow transplantation. A close working relationship is fostered and maintained with CancerCare Manitoba. Nurses on the unit have an active function in all aspects of patient care in collaboration with the unit's interdisciplinary team.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 3 Patients</p>
<p>Clinical Assessment Unit (CAU) 10 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>CAU accepts patients directly from the emergency department that require additional testing/assessment or prolonged observation and interdisciplinary discharge planning. The average length of stay is 72 hours, although some patients require longer stays and admission to inpatient units.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>





<p>GH6 24 beds</p> <p>20 Respiratory Beds and 4 Neurology Beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>H6 provides care to a variety of Respiriology and Neurology patients. Specializes in care for post lung transplant, TB and long term ventilation patients. The unit's team provides care to respiratory and neurological patients with a variety diagnosis and co-morbidities and/or who may be experiencing multi-system complications. Patients require all aspects of care including monitoring, medical intervention and disposition planning. Nurses on the unit have an active function in all aspects of patient care in collaboration with the unit's interdisciplinary team and work closely with their partners in the community and public health for this population.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 6 Patients</p>
<p>GH7 High Observation Unit (HOBS) 12 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>A 12 bed unit that admits acute medicine patients for more intense short term nursing monitoring and intense medical care. An example of the unit's patient population is the Acute Stroke 25 patient and/or the Renal Transplant Recipient for their immediate post-operative care. Patients require all aspects of care including telemetry monitoring, medical intervention and disposition planning.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 3 Patients</p>





MENTAL HEALTH

<p>Addictions Unit: (RR2) 11 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>RR2 is a short stay inpatient unit that provides interdisciplinary care to adult patients going through the acute phase of substance withdrawal. This service is open to any Manitoba resident.</p> <p>Patients may also have a co-occurring medical and/or psychiatric diagnosis. Inpatient group programs are provided as well as a community referral process for continued addiction treatment programs. Dual diagnosis enhanced - CODI initiative.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>
<p>Forensic Program (PX3) 15 beds Plus 6 general psychiatry beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>PX3 is an inpatient unit with the mandate of providing psychiatric assessment and treatment to persons accused, and incarcerated within the criminal justice system for the entire Province of Manitoba.</p> <p>Interdisciplinary assessment and treatment takes place on a secure inpatient unit. The team works in close collaboration with the Community Forensic Mental Health Service. The general beds are designated for individuals who present with acute agitation/aggression in the context of psychosis (+/- substance use) and for whom a locked unit is required.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 4-5 Patients</p>





<p>Mood Disorders Program: PX2 East 23 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>PX2E is an inpatient unit that provides interdisciplinary assessment and treatment to individuals experiencing mood disorders and other mental health conditions, including addictions. The ECT clinic is located outside the inpatient unit but is part of the Mood Disorders Program. The clinic provides ECT and Ketamine treatments for both Mental Health Program inpatients and outpatients</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5 Patients</p>
<p>PX2West 9 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>PX2W was formerly the ROU. Currently the 9 bed unit is “an inpatient unit that provides interdisciplinary assessment and treatment to individuals with a range of mental health conditions. Admissions come from ED, community, CRC and Urgent Care.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5 Patients</p>
<p>PY3N 14 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>PY3N is an inpatient unit that provides interdisciplinary assessment and treatment to individuals experiencing schizophrenia, schizoaffective disorder, co-occurring disorders, and other mental health conditions. The team works in close collaboration with the outpatient Schizophrenia Treatment and Education Program (STEP) and other psychiatric outpatient programs</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5 Patients</p>





<p>PY2: General Psychiatry 25 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>PY2 is an inpatient unit that provides interdisciplinary assessment and treatment to individuals with a range of mental health conditions. The inpatient Adult Eating Disorder beds are also located on PY2.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5 Patients</p>
<p>PY3S Psychiatric Intensive Care Unit 11 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>PY3S is an inpatient unit that provides secure care to individuals experiencing acute crisis. Interdisciplinary care is focused on crisis management, assessment and short-term treatment. Once stabilized, individuals are transferred to other units or discharged to the community.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 4 Patients</p>
<p>PY1N&S Psychiatric Health Child and Adolescent 14 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Nights/Weekends</p> <p>For Senior Practicum Placement Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>The Inpatient unit provides intensive psychiatric medical care to children and adolescents who present with psychiatric emergencies for the residents of Manitoba, parts of Northwest Ontario and part of Nunavut. The staffing model consists of a multidisciplinary team and the admission focus is on acute psychiatric stabilization and diagnosis. The children are seen daily while they are admitted by the interdisciplinary team (psychiatrist, nurse, OT and/or SW) and attend school a variety of group programming while hospitalized</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 3-4 Patients</p>



REHABILITATION PROGRAM

<p>RR5 31 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>RR5 is an inpatient rehabilitation unit that provides comprehensive rehabilitative nursing care to patients with Spinal cord injuries, Amputations and various neuro musculoskeletal conditions. In addition, a number of the patients cared for on RR5 have a broad spectrum of medical co-morbidities. The rehabilitation nurse in collaboration with the interdisciplinary team, the patient and their family, assess, plan, perform, coordinate and evaluate rehabilitative care based on each individual patient's unique circumstances, goals, and most importantly their abilities rather than their disabilities. The rehabilitation nurses together with the interdisciplinary team ensure that individuals impacted by disability are provided with the knowledge, tools and resources they will require in order for their successful return to the community. Nursing staff are actively involved in goal setting, goal progression and education with this rehab population and emphasize self management and self direction of care</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>
<p>RR6 22 Subacute Surgery beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>The RR6 surgical unit facilitates flow from the acute surgical beds to subacute beds for medically stable patients requiring an extended stay post orthopedic, trauma and general surgery/procedures. The subacute beds provide the optimization of the patient's functioning and quality of life. The unit has a strong focus on a multidisciplinary approach to achieve a safe discharge.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>

<p>Central Dialysis Unit (CDU)</p> <p>A6 – 26 stations – 3 x day</p> <p>B6 – 12 stations 3 x day (up to 114 patients /day)</p> <p>JM5 – 22 stations 2 x day (up to 44 patients /day)</p> <p>Sherbrook Dialysis Unit (SCDU) – 23 stations 3 x day</p> <p>(up to 60 patients /day)</p>	<p>As part of the Manitoba Renal Program, the Health Sciences site provides inpatient and outpatient services to those clients that require renal health and/or hemodialysis services. Both chronic and acute hemodialysis provided. At this time, CDU is not accepting senior practicum students due to the specialized training required for our program</p>
<p>The Renal Health Clinic</p> <p>3,200 patients</p>	<p>The Renal Health Clinic provides education and non-dialysis multidisciplinary clinical care for patients with chronic kidney disease.</p>
<p>Community Dialysis</p> <p>16 Community sites</p> <p>107 stations (338 patients)</p>	<p>Provides education and clinical consultation support and follow-up for the Manitoba Local Centre Dialysis units located throughout rural Manitoba.</p>
<p>Home Hemodialysis Program</p> <p>40 patients</p>	<p>Provides education, training and follow up care so that patients can do hemodialysis in their own home</p>

SURGERY PROGRAM

<p>GD2 30 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>An acute orthopedic surgical unit whose clinical expertise focuses on the orthopedic trauma and complex spine patients. The orthopedic population is diverse in its level of care, clinical skills and nursing interventions. D2 incorporates an interdisciplinary team approach to meet the ever-changing needs of the orthopedic patients.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>
<p>GA3 18 ward beds and an 8 bed step-down unit</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>An acute vascular and trauma surgical unit with telemetry monitoring on the ward and cardiac respiratory monitoring on the step-down unit. The eight bed step-down unit facilitates the transfer of patients from the ER, PACU, SICU, and other surgical wards who require closer monitoring, arterial lines and low dose vasopressors.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients; Step down -1 nurse to 3 patients</p>
<p>GD3 28 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>GD3 is the acute trauma/general surgery unit servicing the Province of Manitoba, Inuvik and parts of Northwestern Ontario. Complex emergency surgical candidates are transferred from community and rural hospitals, and repatriated once the patient has been stabilized. Complex Trauma patients are brought here, or are transferred here to access the trauma care team. The four bed step-down unit facilitates the transfer of patients from the ER, PACU, SICU, and other surgical wards who require closer monitoring with telemetry, arterial lines, and a higher nurse to patient ratio than the ward.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>



<p>GH3 30 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>GH3 is a high volume, active Surgical Oncology, General Surgery and Urology post -surgical unit.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>
<p>GA5 & GB5 20 Ward beds and 8-bed step-down unit</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>GA5 Neurosurgery is a unique specialty area and the patient population is exclusive to Health Sciences Centre. This unit provides care to all of Manitoba, Nunavut and Northern Ontario. A5 provides post-operative care for a variety of specialized surgeries such as trauma, tumors, endovascular and strokes. This unit has a strong focus on a multidisciplinary approach to care to support the patients’ journey towards recovery. The unit consist of 20 regular ward beds and 8-bed step-down with more intense nursing resources to provide care to a higher acuity patient population. 4 new Epilepsy monitoring unit is located on B5. This will allow us to provide essential service to our epilepsy population in Manitoba.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients; Step down 1 nurse to 3 patients</p> <p>Epilepsy Beds: 1 nurse to 4 patients</p>
<p>GH5 28 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>GH5 is a 28 bed Surgery Unit dedicated to the care of trauma and cancer patients requiring restorative Plastic Surgery reconstruction and complex Surgical Oncology ENT care. GH5 is also the provincial adult Manitoba Firefighters Burn Unit where Burn, Frostbite and Necrotizing Fasciitis survivors receive specialized collaborative care</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 5-6 Patients</p>





<p>MS3</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights</p>	<p>MS3 is a day surgery unit providing multiple services to adult surgical patients within Health Sciences Centre. All surgical patients for the Adult OR and angiography department begin their journey on MS3 for preoperative preparation which could include interview, assessment, and IV start. MS3 provides postoperative care to patients going home on the same day of surgery MS3 also works collaboratively with the emergency department by providing access and assessment resources for urgent surgical consults. In addition to their day surgery function, MS3 has 10 beds used to provide an overnight stay and early morning discharge for patients who require one night of postoperative monitoring</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 0 specific ratio</p>
<p>Adult Operating Room</p> <p>15 operating room theatres</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>The Adult Operating Room provides perioperative care to patients undergoing major vascular surgery, complex general surgery, ENT/Oral surgery, tertiary urologic surgery, plastic surgery, and orthopedics. All neurosurgery, complex spine, and thoracic surgery for the province is done at this site</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 1-2 Patients</p>
<p>Post-Anesthesia Care Unit</p> <p>12 stretcher bays</p> <p>Shifts: 8 hours Days/Evenings/Weekends</p>	<p>The PACU is a critical care patient care unit that provides care to postoperative patients recovering from a variety of surgical procedures and anesthetics. The focus of care is monitoring the recovery from anesthetic, identifying and treating immediate postoperative complications and facilitating patient flow through the surgical system. The PACU is also a back up unit for overflow surgical or medical intensive care patients. At this time, PACU is not accepting senior practicum students due to the specialized training required for our program.</p> <p>Nurse:Patient Ratio – 1 nurse: 1-2 Patients</p>



WOMEN'S HEALTH PROGRAM

<p>Mother Baby Unit Up to 54 beds</p> <p>Shifts: 12 hours Days/Nights/Weekends</p>	<p>The Mother Baby Unit is located on the 4th floor of the HSC Women's Hospital. Abiding by the principles of family-centered care, mothers and babies remain together 24 hours a day with the same nurse caring for both. The mother's primary support person is encouraged and welcome to stay with her in recognition of the importance of the family as a care client. Our maternal population includes healthy postpartum women as well as women with complex obstetrical, medical, surgical or psychosocial conditions. The newborn population includes healthy term infants, near-term infants and multiples. Infants at risk for conditions such as neonatal abstinence syndrome, hypoglycemia, hyperbilirubinemia, respiratory difficulties, feeding challenges and sepsis are cared for by the nurses on this unit.
