Health Sciences Centre (HSC) Winnipeg's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit provides highquality, specialized care for acutely ill neonates from communities across Manitoba, Northwestern Ontario and Nunavut.

As part of this specialized inter-professional team, you will work closely with neonatologists, nurse practitioners, nurses, respiratory therapists, physical therapists, occupational therapists, pharmacists, dieticians, social workers, nursing assistants, spiritual care workers and families.

# **Matching Patient Needs** to Nursing Experience

At HSC NICU, our patients require different levels of monitoring, assessment and treatment. Our teams are equipped to care for them all.



### **Level One**

Patients who may require different types of assessment, monitoring or treatment beyond usual newborn care



### **Level Two**

Patients who may require regular assessment, monitoring and support for nutrition and possibly oxygen



### **Level Three**

Patients who are stable while receiving CPAP and some system support



### Level Four

Patients who are intubated or more labile on CPAP with frequent treatment adjustments and multiple system supports



### **Level Five**

Patients who are intubated and unstable, requiring constant assessment, significant support and treatment needs



### **Level Six**

Patients who are critically ill, requiring constant assessment and treatment adjustment needs



### Newborn Response Team

Attending deliveries and supporting newborns, including newborn resuscitation in the Women's Hospital



### Charge

Charge nurse for NICU, working collaboratively with the NICU leadership team



# **Education and Orientation**

We'll support you in growing your skills and experience to work with patients of varying acuity.

## Step 1

A combination of independent learning, in person case studies, skills, simulation lab training and buddy shifts, covering broad neonatal topics. Learn to care for level 1-3 patients.

# Step 3

Join the Newborn Response Team. Training includes in class training, independent learning, simulation lab independent learning, case studies, training and buddy shifts.

## Step 2

A combination of independent learning, in person case studies, skills, simulation lab training and buddy shifts. Learn to care for higher acuity patients, level 4-6.

# Step 4

Join the NICU Charge Nurse team. Includes a combination of in class training and buddy shifts.
