The Sexual Assault/ Intimate Partner Violence Program (SA/IPV)

is a group of specially trained female nurses who provide treatment 24-hours a day, seven days a week to people of any gender, aged 14 and older.

These hospital-based supports are available for individuals who have experienced sexual assault (SA) or intimate partner violence (IPV).

The team will provide options and choices about:

- Medical care and/or police reporting – reporting to police will remain YOUR choice
- Medications to prevent infection and pregnancy
- Connections to community resources and counselling services

Forensic Nurse Examiner (FNE)

A Forensic Nurse Examiner is a
Registered Nurse who has undergone
supplementary education and training
to offer comprehensive healthcare
services to individuals who have
experienced sexual assault and
intimate partner violence (IPV).

Forensic Nurse Examiners are also referred to as SANE's (Sexual Assault Nurse Examiner) in certain communities.
